

The Cascadian—A Celebration of the Pacific Northwest's Wild Landscapes and Community Spirit

Pickleball Takes America by Storm: The Fastest-Growing Sport for All Ages

Pickleball has skyrocketed into the limelight as America's fastest-growing sport, beloved by people of all ages—especially seniors—and now making waves internationally, with Bend, Oregon emerging as a prime destination for enthusiastic players. What started as a backyard pastime has blossomed into a nationwide movement, with dedicated courts, community clubs, and lively tournaments drawing players together in cities and retirement communities alike.



Pickleball is especially well-suited for seniors, offering far more than just an entertaining way to stay active. Its low-impact movements make it gentle on the joints while still providing valuable cardiovascular exercise. Regular play has been shown to improve balance, strengthen muscles, and increase joint flexibility, reducing the risk of falls and injuries. Beyond the physical benefits, the sport also supports enhanced cognitive function through strategy, quick decision-making, and coordination. Just as importantly, the social aspect of pickleball—connecting with others on and off the court—helps seniors build friendships, reduce feelings of isolation, and maintain a vibrant sense of community and well-being.

Pickleball Rules and Essentials

One of the reasons pickleball is so accessible is its simple, beginner-friendly rules. The double-bounce rule ensures slower-paced rallies that allow participants time to position themselves, while the non-volley "kitchen" area eliminates overly aggressive net play and encourages controlled strategy. Scoring is serve-based, adding a layer of fun competitiveness without overwhelming new players. Because the game is played on a smaller court compared to tennis, it requires less running, offering a comfortable balance between exercise and enjoyment. Players only need a paddle, a perforated wiffle-like ball, and a flat court with a net to dive in—making pickleball both affordable and approachable.





Community and Lifestyle Impact

What makes pickleball especially appealing is how it extends beyond physical activity to become a lifestyle. Senior communities, fitness centers, and recreational hubs across the country are introducing the sport as a cornerstone activity to encourage healthy, active living. In Bend, Oregon, a city known for its outdoor recreation culture, pickleball has flourished as a way for residents and visitors to connect while enjoying the region's natural beauty. Tournaments and community matches foster friendly competition, while regular meetups bolster social ties within neighborhoods and retirement communities. For many seniors, the court becomes more than just a place to play—it becomes a gathering spot that nurtures camaraderie, inclusion, and lifelong enjoyment.

These breaks allowed him to maintain social connections, relax outdoors, and return home with greater patience.
- A spouse used in-home respite care to take time for herself, visit
 the gym, and enjoy her favorite hobby, a weekly book club. The
 caregiver prepared meals and assisted her husband with
 bathing and dressing.
- A man caring for his wife with Alzheimer's found that her memory loss and daily confusion required constant supervision and reassurance. To prevent caregiver burnout and ensure her safety, he arranged for an in-home care professional to spend several afternoons each week with her. The caregiver offered companionship, helped with personal care, and engaged her in memory-boosting activities such as listening to music and working on simple puzzles. Meanwhile, he was able to run errands, go swimming at the pool, and take much-needed breaks.

Preparing Your Home For A Bend Winter

To properly prepare a home for the winter, residents should focus on insulation, heating system maintenance, plumbing protection, and safety planning to ensure both comfort and resilience during cold weather.

Why Winter Preparation Matters

Winters in Bend bring cold temperatures, snow, and ice, posing risks to property and personal safety. Home preparation reduces the risk of costly damage such as frozen pipes, high energy bills, and roof problems, while also preserving property value.

Essential Steps for Winterizing Your Home

Seal and Insulate

- Inspect windows and doors for drafts, sealing gaps with weatherstripping and caulk.
- Upgrade attic and wall insulation to local recommended R-values for efficiency.
- Install storm windows or apply plastic film to further insulate glass.
- Close gaps around foundations, siding, and external wall penetrations.

Heating System Maintenance

- Schedule a professional furnace tune-up, replacing filters and cleaning the system.
- Check fireplaces and chimneys; have wood-burning units swept and inspected before use.
- Consider upgrading to a smart thermostat for better temperature control and lower bills.

Plumbing Protection

- Drain outdoor faucets and blow out irrigation systems before the first freeze.
- Insulate exposed interior and exterior pipes to prevent bursts.
- Locate and test the home's main water shut-off valve for emergencies.

Roof, Gutters, and Exterior

- Have gutters and downspouts cleaned to prevent ice dams and water backup.
- Have roof inspected for damage, missing shingles, and ensure water can drain away.
- Have tree branches trimmed near structures to prevent breakage and roof impact from snow or ice.

Supplies and Safety

- Stock up on snow shovels, de-icer, sand, and emergency food and water for at least three days.
- Test and replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Review home insurance policies to confirm winter damage coverage.
- Have flashlights, blankets, a portable phone charger, and a backup generator ready for power outages.

Outdoor and Indoor Comfort

- Store or cover outdoor furniture and grills, draining fuel from lawn equipment before storage.
- Apply weatherproof sealant to decks and patios to minimize water and ice damage.
- Use rugs, thermal curtains, and layered bedding for additional indoor warmth.

Local Resources

 Hire local professionals in Bend for sprinkler blowouts, insulation upgrades, roof inspections, and handyman work as needed.

Winterizing Your Sprinklers

Preparing sprinklers and irrigation systems for winter in Bend involves draining water from pipes before freezing temperatures arrive, scheduling a professional blowout, and protecting exposed equipment to prevent costly damage.

Why Winterizing Sprinklers Is Necessary

Freezing temperatures in Central Oregon can cause residual water to expand, crack, and damage underground pipes, pumps, valves, and sprinkler heads. Unprotected systems may lead to major repairs and water waste in the spring.

When to Start Winterization

- Begin the process in mid-October through late November, before nightly freezes consistently threaten underground lines.
- Most local experts recommend scheduling with a professional early, as servicing companies fill up fast.

Sprinkler Blowout: The Key Steps

- Professional blowout uses a high-volume air compressor to safely purge all standing water from the system.
- Each zone is opened sequentially while air is pushed through, ensuring pipes and heads are dry.
- Most companies offer annual service reminders and scheduling for convenience.

DIY Blowout

- Homeowners with large air compressors (preferably 6+ gallon capacity) and the correct fittings can perform the task.
- Important steps include shutting water supply valves, connecting the air compressor, opening system zones one at a time, blowing out water, and monitoring pressure (no more than 50psi advised).
- Comprehensive DIY instructions can be found at local home improvement stores or provided by online forums.

Additional Protection Steps

- Cover or insulate exposed pipes, backflow preventers, and above-ground heads with foam, wraps, or blankets.
- Confirm valve boxes and backflow covers are secured and insulated.
- Delay watering times in early fall to later in the morning to reduce freezing risk on walkways and plants.
- Remove and store all hoses connected to outside faucets.

Professional Service Options

- Many local companies in Bend offer blowout services, typically charging a reasonable price per system depending on zones and complexity.
- Local providers such as Water Works Pump Systems also handle spring start-up and required annual backflow testing in compliance with city regulations.
- Initial consultation is typically free, and regular clients can get scheduled reminders for future years.

Takeaway

Efficient winterization by blowout and insulation is crucial to avoid costly repairs and ensure a smooth spring startup. Professional services can simplify the process, but homeowners with the right tools and knowledge can also DIY.
