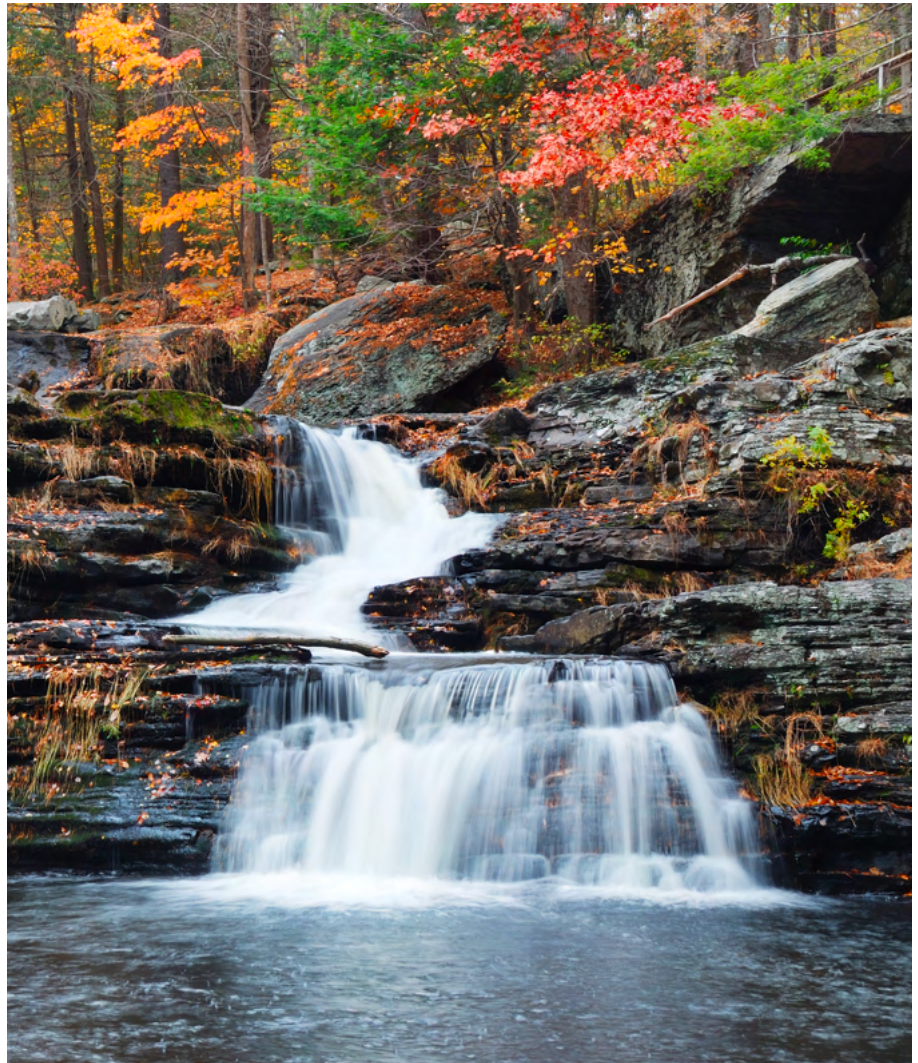

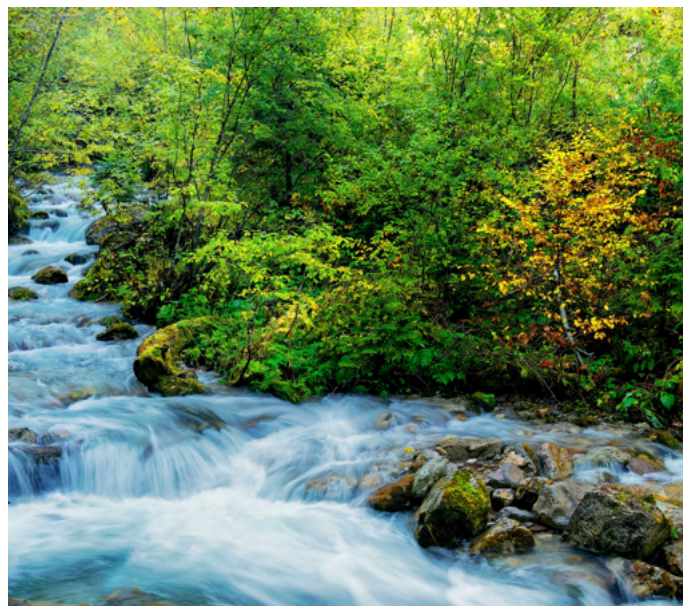

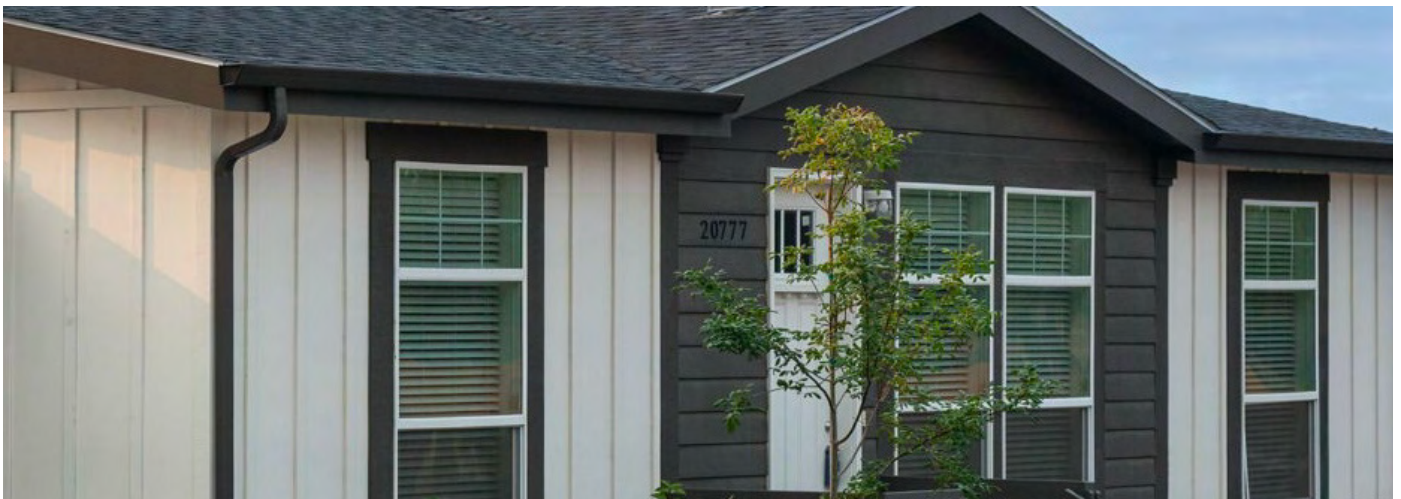

Fall Recipe



Autumn Harvest Chicken

Savor the comforting essence of autumn with this elegant one-pan chicken, where classic flavors unite in effortless harmony. Tender, golden-seared chicken breasts bask in a sumptuous cider-infused sauce, infused with the sweetness of apples, the richness of caramelized onions, and the herbaceous lift of fresh thyme. Each bite delivers warmth and nostalgia—an invitation to linger at the table, especially when paired with creamy mashed potatoes or a cloud of fluffy rice, ready to soak up every decadent drop.

Total Time: 30 mins
Serves: 4

Ingredients:

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 2 tablespoons olive oil or butter
- 1 large onion, thinly sliced
- 2 apples, thinly sliced (Honeycrisp or Gala recommended)
- 1 cup apple cider (not vinegar)
- ½ cup chicken broth
- 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves (or ½ teaspoon dried thyme)
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Method:

1. Generously season the chicken breasts with salt and pepper.
2. In a broad, heavy skillet, heat the olive oil or butter over medium-high heat. Add the chicken and sear until each side is beautifully golden—about 3–4 minutes per side. Transfer to a plate and keep warm.
3. Lower the heat slightly, then add the onions to the same pan. Sauté for 3–4 minutes, or until they soften and turn translucent, stirring occasionally.
4. Toss in the apple slices and continue to cook for 2–3 minutes, allowing them to release their natural sweetness yet retain their shape.
5. Pour in the apple cider and chicken broth, using a wooden spoon to deglaze and coax up any caramelized bits from the bottom of the skillet.
6. Stir in the thyme, then nestle the chicken back among the apples and onions. Let everything simmer gently, uncovered, for 8–10 minutes, until the chicken is cooked through and the sauce has reduced to a glossy finish.
7. Serve immediately over a bed of mashed potatoes or rice, lavishly spooning the pan sauce and fruit over the top.

Tip: For a finishing touch, sprinkle with extra fresh thyme or a whisper of cracked pepper just before serving to heighten the autumnal aroma.

Fall Home Maintenance

For Cascade Village Manufactured Homes

Autumn in Bend, OR brings cooler temperatures, rain, and possible frost—making seasonal maintenance essential for manufactured homeowners in Cascade Village. Use these expert tips to protect your residence, prepare for winter, and keep your property in top shape.

Exterior Preparation

- **Inspect and Seal Your Skirting:** Check the skirting panels around the base of the home for gaps, cracks, or loose panels. Tighten fasteners and use weatherproof sealant on any gaps to keep out moisture and reduce heat loss.
- **Clear Gutters and Downspouts:** Remove fallen leaves, pine needles, and debris from gutters and downspouts. Run water through the system to ensure it flows freely and directs water away from the foundation.
- **Check Roof and Flashing:** Use binoculars to inspect for damaged shingles, leaks, or worn flashing. Promptly patch or replace problem areas to prevent leaks during autumn rainfall.
- **Touch Up Paint and Caulking:** Examine exterior walls, trim, doors, and windows for peeling paint or failed caulking. Repair as needed to prevent wood rot and improve weather resistance.

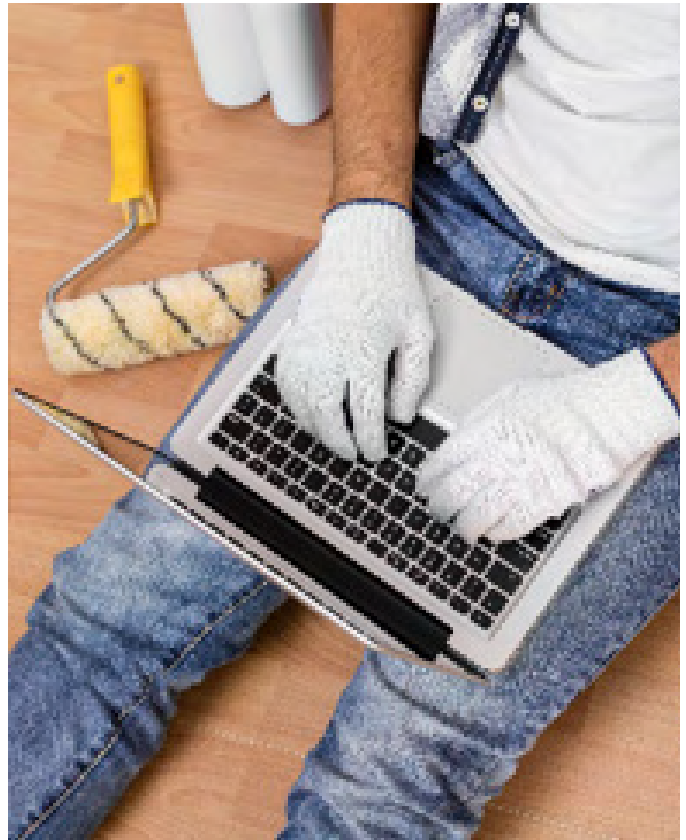
Windows and Doors

- **Weatherstripping and Draft Checks:** Test for drafts around window and door frames. Replace weatherstripping or apply caulk as needed. This significantly reduces heating costs and keeps homes comfortable.
- **Storm Doors and Windows:** Install storm windows or doors if available, or ensure existing ones are tightly sealed.

Plumbing Safeguards

- **Insulate Pipes:** Wrap exposed exterior pipes and crawl space plumbing with foam insulation sleeves to protect against freeze damage.
- **Check for Leaks:** Review under sinks, around water heaters, and in bathrooms for signs of drip leaks or pooling water. Address minor issues early to prevent wintertime plumbing emergencies.



HOME TIPS

HVAC and Heating Systems

- **Replace HVAC Filters:** Change the filters in furnace or heat pump systems, improving air quality and efficiency.
- **Program Thermostat:** Set programmable thermostats for cooler weather. Aim for 68°F daytime and lower at night to save on energy.
- **Test Heating Before Cold Hits:** Run your heating system early in the season to ensure it operates well. Schedule professional service for any unusual noises or performance issues.

Safety Precautions

- **Check Smoke and CO Detectors:** Replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, and test each one to verify operation.
- **Review Fire Extinguishers:** Make sure at least one working fire extinguisher is accessible in the home, especially near kitchens and heating systems.

Landscaping and Grounds

- **Rake and Remove Fallen Leaves:** Clear leaves from lawns, walkways, patios, and driveways to prevent slip hazards and encourage healthy grass growth.

PET RULES & REGULATIONS

Cascade Village values the companionship that pets bring to our community and strives to maintain a welcoming environment for all residents. To ensure harmony and uphold the well-being of both residents and their animals, we kindly remind all residents to adhere to the established pet rules and regulations.

Pet Approval and Permitted Animals

- All pets must receive prior approval from the Community Owner and require a signed Pet Agreement before residing in the community.
- Each household is generally permitted one dog or one cat weighing under 50 pounds at full maturity. Any exceptions—such as breeds identified as potentially aggressive (including Rottweilers, Pit Bulls, and Dobermans)—require advance written authorization from the Owner.
- Residents with disabilities are entitled to keep service animals or emotional support animals as provided by applicable laws.

Pet Care, Supervision, and Conduct

- Pets must be kept primarily within the resident's home; the use of outdoor pet runs or dog houses is not allowed.
- Whenever outside, pets must be on a leash and under the resident's direct control at all times.
- Owners are responsible for immediately cleaning up pet waste and disposing of it properly in designated trash receptacles.
- Pets may not roam freely, be left unattended outdoors, or enter shared amenities such as the clubhouse or pool area. Any unattended animals may be impounded at the resident's expense.

Pet Privileges and Enforcement

- The privilege of keeping a pet may be revoked if an animal is not properly cared for or is found to disturb the peace, act aggressively, or pose a nuisance to the community.
- Residents are expected to promptly provide proof of licensing and vaccination upon request.
- Violations of these rules, following written notice, may result in a \$50 fine per occurrence as permitted by Oregon law. Repeated or unresolved issues may lead to further action or loss of pet privileges.

Service and Support Animals

Cascade Village fully complies with all local, state, and federal regulations regarding service animals and emotional support animals. The community supports residents' rights to necessary accommodations while expecting all animal owners to observe the general standards for conduct, containment, and care.

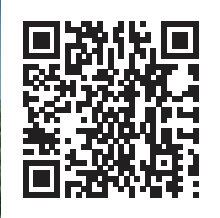

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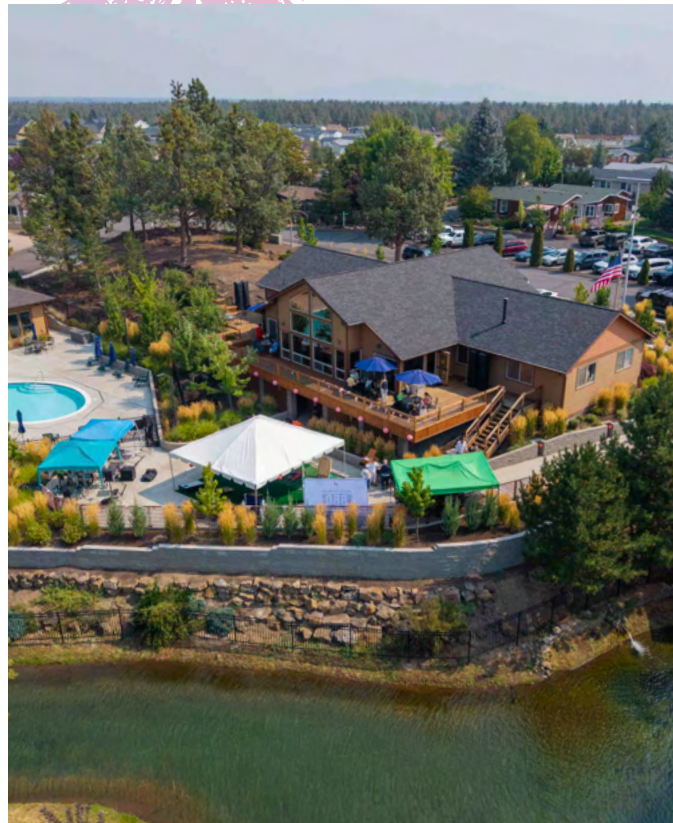
