Promoting Safe Use of Low Speed Vehicles (LSVs) and E-Bikes in Cascade Village

As the Cascade Village community continues to grow, so does the popularity of Low Speed Vehicles (LSVs), such as golf carts, and E-Bikes. These eco-friendly transportation options provide a convenient way for residents to navigate our picturesque neighborhood while reducing our environmental footprint. However, the safety of all community members is paramount. This article aims to encourage the safe use of LSVs and E-Bikes by highlighting the importance of adhering to Oregon laws and practicing responsible riding.

Understanding Oregon Laws for LSVs and E-Bikes

Before embarking on any journey using LSVs or E-Bikes in Cascade Village, it's essential for riders to be well-informed about the relevant regulations established by the state of Oregon:

1. Low Speed Vehicles (LSVs): In Oregon, LSVs are defined as vehicles that can travel up to 25 miles per hour and may include golf carts when used on public roadways. LSVs are required to have certain safety features, including headlights, brake lights, turn signals, and rearview mirrors. Additionally, drivers must have a valid driver's license, and LSVs can only operate on roads with a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less.

2. E-Bikes: In Oregon, E-Bikes are categorized into three classes:

- **Class 1:** E-Bikes that provide assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceases to provide assistance when reaching 20 mph.

- **Class 2:** E-Bikes that have a throttle and can provide assistance even when the rider is not pedaling, limited to 20 mph.

- **Class 3:** E-Bikes that provide assistance only when the rider is pedaling, with a top assisted speed of 28 mph. Class 3 E-Bikes are not allowed on bike paths unless local regulations permit.

All riders should follow these classifications and comply with local laws regarding helmet use at all times.



Encouraging Safe Practices in Cascade Village

1. Know and Follow the Rules

Adhering to Oregon's LSV and E-Bike laws is crucial for safety. Riders should familiarize themselves with designated routes, speed limits, and right-of-way regulations to reduce the risk of accidents.

2. Wear Protective Gear

Safety should always come first. Helmets are important for E-Bike riders. Consider wearing additional protective gear, such as knee and elbow pads, to enhance safety while riding.

3. Regular Vehicle Maintenance

Maintaining your LSV or E-Bike is essential for safe operation. Regularly check tire pressure, battery levels, brakes, and lights to ensure that your vehicle is in good working order prior to each ride.

4. Practice Defensive Riding

Always remain alert and aware of your surroundings. Keep a safe distance from pedestrians, other vehicles, and potential obstacles. Signal your intentions when turning or stopping to inform others of your movements.

5. Create Safe Riding Spaces

Advocate for designated lanes or paths for LSVs and E-Bikes within Cascade Village. Clear signage and well-maintained infrastructure can enhance the safety of both riders and pedestrians.

6. Share the Road

Promote respect among all road users. Encourage LSV and E-Bike riders to be courteous to pedestrians and motorists, reinforcing that everyone has a role in maintaining peace on the road.

Pool Opening & Water Yoga: The community pool is scheduled to open as soon as weather conditions allow in May. We are excited to announce that water yoga classes will resume in June!

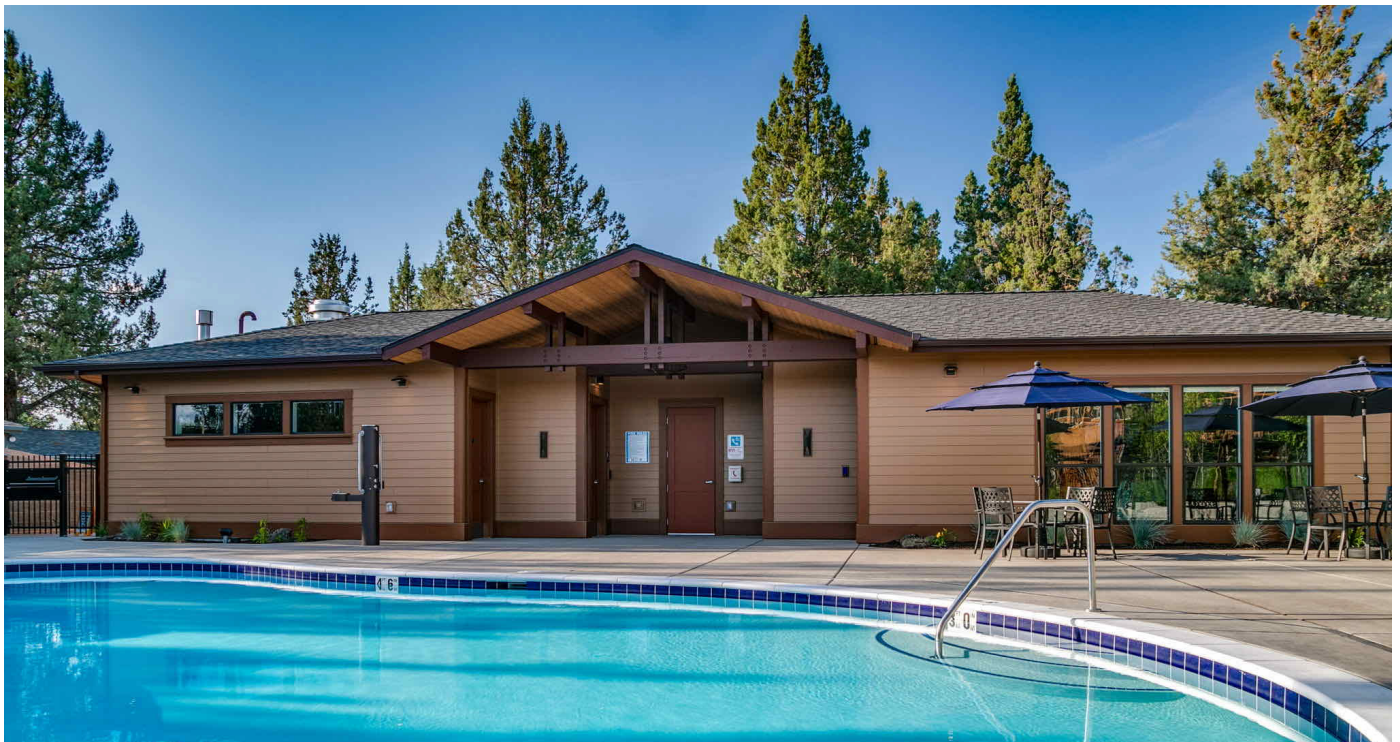
Pinochle Group Summer Break: The Pinochle group will take a summer break following their meeting on May 19th, with plans to reconvene on September 8th.

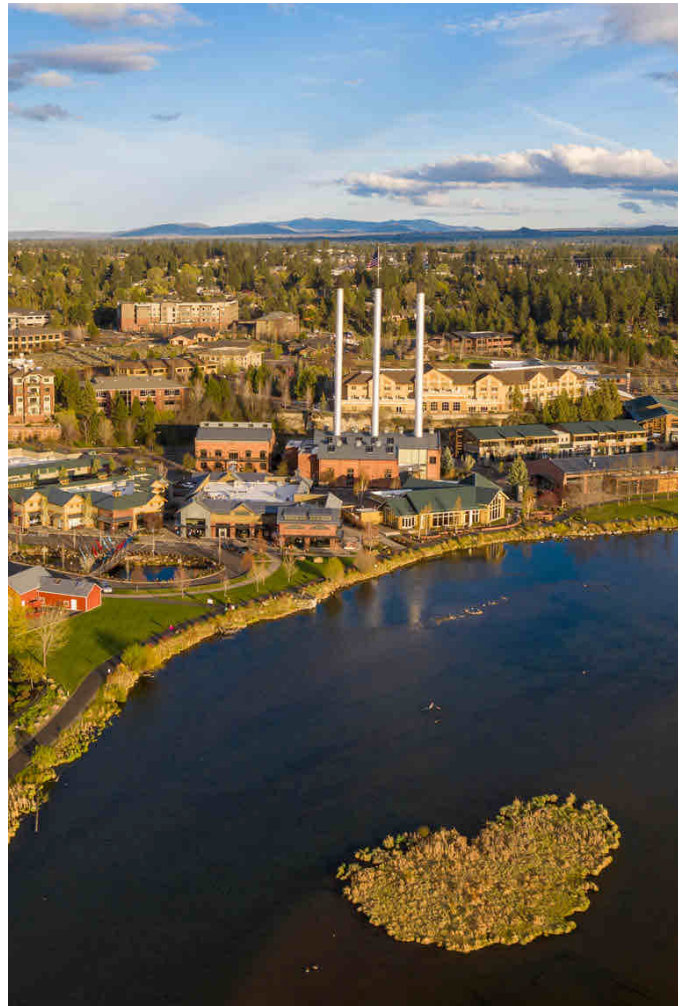
